#### MINUTES OF THE ADJOURNED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF VISTA IRRIGATION DISTRICT

#### May 15, 2019

An Adjourned Meeting of the Board of Directors of Vista Irrigation District was held on Wednesday, May 15, 2019, at the offices of the District, 1391 Engineer Street, Vista, California.

#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

President MacKenzie called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

#### 2. ROLL CALL

Directors present: Miller, Vásquez, Dorey, Sanchez, and MacKenzie.

Directors absent: None.

Staff present: Brett Hodgkiss, General Manager; Ramae Ogilvie, Assistant Secretary of the Board; Randy Whitmann, Director of Engineering; Frank Wolinski, Director of Operations and Field Services; and Matt Atteberry, Engineering Project Manager; and Mark Saltz, Water Resource Specialist. General Counsel Dave Cosgrove was also present.

Other attendees: Special Counsel John Carter was present for agenda Item 7.

#### **3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Director Dorey led the pledge of allegiance.

#### 4. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

19-05-58 Upon motion by Director Vásquez, seconded by Director Miller and unanimously carried (5 ayes: Miller, Vásquez, Dorey, Sanchez, and MacKenzie), the Board of Directors approved the agenda as presented.

#### 5. **PUBLIC COMMENT TIME**

No public comments were presented on items not appearing on the agenda.

#### 6. CONSENT CALENDAR

19-05-59 Upon motion by Director Vásquez, seconded by Director Dorey and unanimously carried (5 ayes: Miller, Vásquez, Dorey, Sanchez, and MacKenzie), the Board of Directors approved the Consent Calendar, including Resolution No. 19-16 approving disbursements.

#### A. Grant of Right of Way and Quitclaim Deed

See staff report attached hereto. Staff recommended and the Board accepted Grant of Right of Way (R50) and approved Quitclaim Deed (671) for a single-family residence consisting of approximately 2.2 gross acres owned by Alfonso W. and Sandra A. Rodriguez located at 1191 Sweetlime Road, Vista (LN 2018-041; APN 126-340-49; DIV 1).

B. Microsoft Software Licensing Agreement Software

See staff report attached hereto. Staff recommended and the Board authorized the General Manager to enter into a Microsoft Enterprise Agreement with SoftwareOne for the three-year period ending May 31, 2022 in amount not to exceed \$106,059.

C. Minutes of Board of Directors meeting on May 1, 2019

The minutes of May 1, 2019 were approved as presented.

D. Resolution ratifying check disbursements

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 19-16**

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of Vista Irrigation District does hereby approve checks numbered 61498 through 61621 drawn on Union Bank totaling \$356,660.61.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Directors does hereby authorize the execution of the checks by the appropriate officers of the District.

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# 7. APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT TO SECURE EASEMENT FOR SAN PASQUAL UNDERGROUNDING PROJECT

See staff report attached hereto.

General Manager Brett Hodgkiss updated the Board on the status of the San Pasqual Undergoing Project (Project). Mr. Hodgkiss stated that the City of Escondido (Escondido) has secured easements across the San Pasqual Indian reservation as well as two private parcels referred to as the Thompson parcels. The last easement to be secured is across fee title land owned by the San Pasqual Band of Diegueno Mission Indians of California (Band).

Special Counsel John Carter provided an overview of the Agreement for Conveyance of an Easement (Easement Agreement) between Escondido, Vista Irrigation District (District) and the Band. Mr. Carter stated that the Easement Agreement is in accordance with Paragraph 5.C. of the San Luis Rey Indian Rights Implementing Agreement (Implementing Agreement) approved on December 5, 2014 by Escondido, the District, the San Luis Rey River Indian Water Authority and the La Jolla, Rincon, San Pasqual, Pauma, and Pala Bands of Mission Indians pursuant to the San Luis Rey Indian Water Rights Settlement Act, Public Law 100-675, as amended. Paragraph 5.C. of the Implementing Agreement refers to the Project and provides that the District and Escondido remove and replace the Escondido Canal located within the San

Pasqual Reservation with an underground pipe and associated facilities and agree to reclaim the land occupied by the replaced canal. Mr. Carter said that the Band acquired fee land where a portion of the existing canal is located as well as where a portion of the new pipeline will be located.

Mr. Carter summarized the Easement Agreement, stating that the Band will grant an easement on its recently acquired fee land for the pipeline; the District and Escondido will pay the Band the negotiated amount of \$78,500, which encompassed \$21,500 for the appraised value of the land for the easement and \$57,000 for loss of use of the well located on the easement; the District and Escondido will decommission the well and agree to reclaim the land where the well was located; the District and Escondido will remove the portion of the Escondido Canal that is located on the newly acquired fee land and reclaim said land; the District and Escondido will relinquish the existing easements on the San Pasqual Reservation and fee lands where the Escondido Canal is to be removed; and the Band will grant the District and Escondido a temporary license to provide for access, storage, and other uses during construction.

Mr. Hodgkiss stated that the easement is just over 39,000 square feet. Mr. Carter provided clarification regarding the cost assessment for the loss of use of a well, stating that the Band originally provided a higher estimate for the loss of the well and that cost was negotiated down to \$57,000. Mr. Hodgkiss stated that the completion time for the reclamation portion of the Project across the fee land will be 12 months after the completion of the Project.

Mr. Carter stated that the Band had signed all the documents; Escondido City Council was to consider approval of the documents on May 22.

#### 8. ANNUAL CONTRACT FOR PAVING SERVICES

See staff report attached hereto.

Director of Operations and Field Services Frank Wolinski stated that the District has progressively increased the scope of its paving contracts over the past four years in an effort to enhance the District's ability to be responsive in the repair of roadways. He pointed out that the District spent approximately \$761,000 annually for paving services (via contractual paving services and competitively bid jobs) in fiscal years 2017 and 2018 with \$480,000 of paving work being performed under the contract in fiscal year 2018. Mr. Wolinski stated that during the first three quarters of fiscal year 2019 all services had been performed

under the paving contract (\$550,000), leaving just \$50,000 available for the balance of work to be performed this fiscal year. He stated that the requested amendment to the current agreement with Joe's Paving, Inc. (increasing the contract amount to not to exceed \$800,000) is to cover approximately \$200,000 in estimated paving services that are still needed for the remainder of fiscal year 2019.

Mr. Wolinski reviewed Joe's Paving, Inc.'s proposed price increases for fiscal year 2020 contract extension, stating that the price increases reflect higher material and labor costs. Mr. Hodgkiss clarified that the extension is for one year.

19-05-61 Upon motion by Director Sanchez, seconded by Director Vásquez and unanimously carried (5 ayes: Miller, Vásquez, Dorey, Sanchez, and MacKenzie), the Board of Directors authorized the General Manager to amend the existing contract with Joe's Paving, Inc. to provide paving services on District projects in an amount not to exceed \$800,000 and to extend the contract with proposed new pricing for fiscal year 2020 in an amount not to exceed \$800,000.

#### 9. ANNUAL CONTRACT FOR TRAFFIC CONTROL SERVICES

See staff report attached hereto.

Mr. Wolinski presented the bid results for traffic control services for District jobs. He explained that staff performed an analysis of the District's billed hours (regular, overtime and weekend/holidays) for traffic control services over the past three fiscal years applying proposed rates and determined that Cecilia's Safety Service, Inc. (Cecilia's) would provide the District with the lowest cost option by approximately \$10,000 to \$12,000 a year.

Director Dorey requested clarification as to why Cecilia's regular and overtime hourly rates were the same. Mr. Wolinski responded that Cecilia's has indicated that they have staff on standby that don't work every day, which allows them to pull from those employees to work shifts outside normal business hours at a regular pay rate rather than an overtime pay rate.

19-05-62 Upon motion by Director Miller, seconded by Director Dorey and unanimously carried (5 ayes: Miller, Vásquez, Dorey, Sanchez, and MacKenzie), the Board of Directors authorized the General Manager to execute an agreement with Cecilia's Safety Service, Inc. to provide traffic control services for District jobs in an amount not to exceed \$550,000.

#### 10. MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE ACTIVITIES OF THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY

See staff report attached hereto.

Director Miller stated that there has not been a meeting of the San Diego County Water Authority (Water Authority) Board of Directors since his last report. He reported that the Regional Water Quality Control Board recently approved the permit for the new seawater intake and discharge facilities at the Claude "Bud" Lewis Carlsbad Desalination Plant.

Mr. Hodgkiss reported on information he received from Glenn Farrel, Government Relations Manager for the Water Authority regarding the budget trailer bill. He said that Senate Budget Subcommittee 2 on Resources will be taking up the budget trailer bill, which includes the identification of a revenue source for the Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Fund. Mr. Hodgkiss said that the Committee is recommending the use of \$150 million of General Fund monies derived from a recent U.S. Supreme Court decision, "Wayfair vs South Dakota" (which is the remittance of sales tax from online retailers), rather than the imposition of a water tax as a continuous revenue source for the Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Fund.

Mr. Hodgkiss stated that the reusable bags provided to each Board member at the dais were part of the Water Authority's *Brought to You By Water* campaign on agriculture. He reported that these bags were distributed at the Vista Farmer's Market as part of the Water Authority's campaign.

Director Miller stated that he would be out of town for the next meeting of the Water Authority Board of Directors scheduled for May 23, 2019. He indicated that he would receive the summary notes from the meeting and provide a recap to the Board at its June 5 meeting.

#### 11. MEETINGS AND EVENTS

See staff report attached hereto.

Director Dorey reported on his attendance at the recent Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) Conference where he attended the ACWA Joint Powers Insurance Authority (ACWA/JPIA) Board of Directors Meeting. He informed the Board that he was not elected to serve on the ACWA/JPIA Executive Committee or the California Water Insurance Fund Committee. Director Dorey also reported on his attendance at the ACWA Groundwater Committee as well as the ACWA Agriculture Committee, where he heard a presentation by Friant Water Authority on the approaches to achieve water balance.

Director Sanchez reported on his attendance at the ACWA Conference where he attended a meeting of the ACWA Energy Committee; the Committee discussion covered the Public Safety Shutoff Program. He also attended the ACWA Water Management Committee meeting where the discussion centered on the Delta Flow Voluntary Agreements. He further reported that he attended a sessions on water rates and regulation trends, which reviewed social media advocacy in the industry, new water quality standards and future taxation of water rates throughout the country. Director Sanchez suggested that the District consider developing a formal written plan dealing with social media. He also reported that he attended the ACWA Region 10 session, which provided a good overview of issues discussed by each ACWA Committee.

Director Vásquez reported on his attendance at the ACWA Conference where he attended a meeting of the ACWA Water Quality Committee; the Committee discussed the steelhead recovery program, which includes establishing river flows throughout the region. Director Vásquez voiced concern about the impact the river flows could have on the Henshaw Dam and Lake Henshaw. He reported that he also attended a session regarding water rates and regulation trends and a session regarding the development of the next generation of water system operators. Director Vásquez also reported on his attendance at a session titled "Surveying the Landscape for the New Urban Water Conservation Objectives", which focused on the implementation of the 2018 water conservation legislation. He also attended the Region 10 Board Meeting.

President MacKenzie reported on her attendance at the ACWA Conference where she heard Joaquin Esquivel, the Chair of the California State Water Resources Control Board, discuss the need to update the San Francisco Bay/Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Estuary Water Quality Plan and the State's "no net loss" policy regarding the State's wetlands. She attended a luncheon where Jared Blumenfeld, Secretary of Environmental Protection for California Environmental Protection Agency, talked about the collaborative approach the State and Federal Environmental Protection Agencies are taking to address environmental protection related issues. President MacKenzie reported that she also attended a meeting of the ACWA Membership Committee where the Committee's goals and objectives were reviewed.

President MacKenzie reported on her participation on the California Special Districts Association (CSDA) Legislative Committee conference call where they reviewed various bills. She also attended the California Local Agencies Formation Commission Board Meeting, where the new dues structure was discussed; dues will be going up by about \$4,000. President MacKenzie also informed the Board about a lawsuit involving the San Luis Obispo Local Agencies Formation Commission and its attempt to collect attorney fees from an applicant using the indemnification clause contained in its annexation application. She requested that staff and General Counsel review the indemnification clauses contained in various District documents to ensure that the language is up to date and provides adequate protections for the District.

Director Vásquez requested to attend the tour of the facilities of the Mesa Water District and the Orange County Water District, which will be hosted by the ACWA Communications Committee (Committee) on June 13, 2019 at 9:30 a.m. and will include a business meeting of the Committee. Directors Vásquez and Sanchez both requested to attend the ACWA Region 10 Program on July 30, 2019 at the Arroyo Trabuco-Orange County Golf Course.

19-05-63 Upon motion by Director Miller, seconded by Director Dorey and unanimously carried (5 ayes: Miller, Vásquez, Dorey, Sanchez, and MacKenzie), the Board of Directors approved the following attendances: Director Vásquez to attend the ACWA Communications Committee tour of facilities at the Mesa Water District and the Orange County Water District on June 13, 2019; and Directors Vásquez and Sanchez to attend the ACWA Region 10 Program at the Arroyo Trabuco Canyon Golf Course on July 30, 2019.

#### 12. ITEMS FOR FUTURE AGENDAS AND/OR PRESS RELEASES

Mr. Hodgkiss reviewed the list of tentative items for future agendas; there was a brief discussion regarding the timelines for the ACWA Region 10 nominations and ACWA and CSDA committee appointments.

#### **13.** COMMENTS BY DIRECTORS

President MacKenzie informed the Board that the wife of Ron Holloway, Principal at BHA, Inc. passed away. BHA, Inc. performs surveying services for the District.

#### 14. COMMENTS BY GENERAL MANAGER

Mr. Hodgkiss suggested the date of Thursday August 8, 2019 at 9:00 a.m. for the Water Supply Planning Workshop. The Board presented no objection to the suggested date.

Mr. Hodgkiss also informed the Board that the District has completed all work necessary to move forward with the completion of the sale of the property on Warmlands Avenue. He stated that payment has been received, and the Quitclaim Deed has been prepared for signature by the Board President.

General Counsel David Cosgrove reported on a recent ruling in *Horizon Capital Investments, LLC v. City of Sacramento.* Citing previous case law, the Sacramento Superior Court invalidated a special tax established by the City of Sacramento, determining that the "qualified electors" of a community facilities district are the registered voters of the entity imposing the special tax, not the landowners within such district.

#### **15. ADJOURNMENT**

There being no further business to come before the Board, at 10:32 a.m., President MacKenzie adjourned the meeting.

## <u>SUBJECT</u>: GRANT OF RIGHT OF WAY AND QUITCLAIM DEED

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Accept Grant of Right of Way (R50) and approve Quitclaim Deed (671) for a single-family residence consisting of approximately 2.2 gross acres owned by Alfonso W. and Sandra A. Rodriguez located at 1191 Sweetlime Road, Vista (LN 2018-041; APN 126-340-49; DIV 1).

PRIOR BOARD ACTION: None.


FISCAL IMPACT: None.

<u>SUMMARY</u>: Acceptance of Grant of Right of Way (R50) via easement document and approval of Quitclaim Deed (671) will allow the District to secure a dedicated 20-foot specific easement over the private property and allow the District to record these documents with the County Recorder.

<u>DETAILED REPORT</u>: The owners, Alfonso W. and Sandra A. Rodriguez, are in the process of developing a single-family residence on 2.2 gross acres located at 1191 Sweetlime Road (APN 126-340-49). On February 8, 2019, the owner made application and paid the necessary fees to the District for a 1-inch domestic Temporary Offsite Service in accordance with the District's Rules and Regulations Section 3.8.6.

Acceptance of Grant of Right of Way (R50) will allow the installation of future water facilities to be located within a 20-foot dedicated specific easement. The owners have requested that portions of Blanket Easements (H73.5), which will no longer be needed, be quitclaimed over APN 126-340-49; staff recommends that the Board President sign the Quitclaim Deed (671) after the Grant of Right of Way is recorded to maintain prior rights. Approval and acceptance of these items will allow the owner to proceed with the development of their project.

## SUBJECT: MICROSOFT SOFTWARE LICENSING AGREEMENT

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Authorize the General Manager to enter into a Microsoft Enterprise Agreement with SoftwareOne for the three-year period ending May 31, 2022 in amount not to exceed \$106,059.

<u>PRIOR BOARD ACTION</u>: On May 11, 2016, the Board authorized the General Manager to enter into a Microsoft Enterprise Agreement (MEA) with SoftwareOne for \$41,860 annually for three years ending May 31, 2019, for a total contract price of \$125,580.

FISCAL IMPACT: Annual fees are \$35,353 for the next three years, for a total contract price of \$106,059.

<u>SUMMARY</u>: Microsoft regularly provides product upgrades, maintenance releases and patches. With this agreement, the District purchases the right to continued upgrades without interruption,  $24 \times 7$  technical support, unlimited web support, access to the most recent software versions, simplified license tracking and reduced risks of license noncompliance.

<u>DETAILED REPORT</u>: The District has utilized an MEA since 2004; the current agreement expires on May 31, 2019. The agreement offers the District the ability to have a level pay program for software maintenance and upgrades on District computers and servers. This agreement will be for a term of 3 years.

The County of Riverside has been the leader in the negotiations and procurement of the statewide cooperative license purchase agreements for statewide Microsoft Enterprise software and services; over 300 governmental agencies in California utilize this enterprise agreement. The County of Riverside's volume of licenses for Microsoft products allowed them to obtain deep discounts by going through a competitive bidding process resulting in SoftwareOne being selected as a Microsoft reseller for licensing purposes.

Pursuant to the District's Purchasing Policy, staff recommends taking advantage of the cooperative purchasing power of the County of Riverside in choosing SoftwareOne as the vendor for these licensing services.

**STAFF REPORT** 

# <u>SUBJECT</u>: APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT TO SECURE EASEMENT FOR SAN PASQUAL UNDERGROUNDING PROJECT

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Adopt Resolution No. 19-XX approving an Agreement for Conveyance of an Easement (Agreement) between City of Escondido (Escondido), Vista Irrigation District (VID), and San Pasqual Band of Diegueno Mission Indians of California (Band) and authorizing the District Board President to sign the Agreement on behalf of the District; and authorizing District officers, staff and legal counsel to represent in open court in the United States District Court for the Southern District of California that the District understands and agrees with the terms of this Agreement, validly exercised its governmental power to be bound by its terms, and that the District has received adequate legal representation in reaching that conclusion.

<u>PRIOR BOARD ACTION</u>: On December 8, 2014, the Board approved the San Luis Rey Indian Water Rights Implementing Agreement (Implementing Agreement) between Escondido, VID, San Luis Rey River Indian Water Authority, and La Jolla, Rincon, San Pasqual, Pauma, and Pala Bands of Mission Indians pursuant to the San Luis Rey Indian Water Rights Settlement Act, Public Law 100-675, as amended.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT</u>: The Agreement provides that Escondido and VID jointly pay the Band \$78,500 (\$39,250 by each party) as consideration for the easement and the potable water well within the easement. It also provides that Escondido and VID pay unknown costs related to decommissioning the well within the easement and removing the Escondido Canal, reclaiming the land occupied by said canal and relinquishing easements for said canal on certain fee lands owned by the Band. All costs will be divided equally between Escondido and VID.

<u>SUMMARY</u>: Under the terms of the Implementing Agreement dated December 5, 2014, Escondido and VID are jointly responsible for the project to remove, relocate and replace with an underground pipeline most or all of that portion of the Escondido Canal that currently occupies land within the San Pasqual Reservation (Project). The Project alignment crosses new fee lands from the point where it leaves the San Pasqual Reservation and enters the public right of way in Lake Wohlford Road. The Agreement was negotiated with the San Pasqual Band to provide for an easement across Assessor's Parcel 189-060-08 which the Band owns.

<u>DETAILED REPORT</u>: The Project alignment crosses three private parcels from the point where it leaves the San Pasqual Reservation and enters the public right of way in Lake Wohlford Road. Escondido had an appraisal of the value of the easement required across these parcels prepared in 2017, and easements were secured from a private party crossing two of these parcels (APN 189-060-42 and -44) in December 2018. The Agreement provides for a payment to the Band of \$78,500 to reimburse them for both the value of the easement and the value of the well located within that easement. The Agreement also requires Escondido and VID to perform tasks necessary to decommission that well prior to construction and to reclaim the land presently occupied by the Escondido Canal on other parcels owned in fee title the Band once the Project is complete.

#### RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF VISTA IRRIGATION DISTRICT APPROVING THE AGREEMENT FOR CONVEYANCE OF AN EASEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF ESCONDIDO, VISTA IRRIGATION DISTRICT AND SAN PASQUAL BAND OF DIEGUENO MISSION INDIANS OF CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS, Vista Irrigation District (VID or District) is a Party to the San Luis Rey Indian Water Rights Settlement Agreement (Settlement), which became effective on May 17, 2017 pursuant to the San Luis Rey Indian Water Rights Settlement Act, Public Law 100-675, as amended; and

WHEREAS, City of Escondido (Escondido), VID and San Pasqual Band of Diegueno Mission Indians (Band) are Parties to an Implementing Agreement dated December 5, 2014, which is an exhibit to, and included as part of, the Settlement; and

WHEREAS, as described in Section 5.C. of the Implementing Agreement, Escondido and VID are currently in the process of constructing pipeline utilities through the related project commonly known as the San Pasqual Undergrounding Project (Project); and

WHEREAS, the Band has agreed to cooperate with and support Escondido and VID in the implementation of the Project and will grant an easement for the portion of the project that will occupy the Band's Reservation Land (Reservation Easement); and

WHEREAS, the Band is also the fee simple owner of the property located at 27509 N. Lake Wohlford Road, California, and also known as Assessor Parcel No. 189-060-08 (Property); and

WHEREAS, Escondido wishes to acquire and the Band agrees to convey an exclusive, permanent easement on the Property for water utility purposes in a location to be more particularly described in Section 3 of the Agreement for Conveyance of an Easement (Easement); and

WHEREAS, there is a certain potable water well and appurtenances on the Property within the Easement area (Well) that the Band agrees may be decommissioned by Escondido and VID; and

WHEREAS, the Band owns certain land in fee that is not contained within the San Pasqual Reservation, but is currently encumbered by the easement for the existing Escondido Canal which is to be replaced by a pipeline and this Easement known as Assessor Parcel Nos. 189-181-10 &16 (Fee Land); and

WHEREAS, the Parties now wish to establish the terms, conditions, and consideration associated with the acquisition of the Easement, decommissioning of the Well, and construction of the Project in the Easement area.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Directors of the Vista Irrigation District does hereby resolve as follows:

Section 1. The Agreement for Conveyance of an Easement (Agreement), attached hereto as Exhibit "1", is hereby approved, and the Board President is hereby authorized to execute the Agreement.

Section 2. District officers, staff and legal counsel are hereby authorized to represent in open court in the United States District Court for the Southern District of California that the District understands and agrees with the terms of the Agreement, validly exercised its governmental power to be bound by its terms, and that the District has received adequate legal representation in reaching that conclusion.

Section 3. District staff is hereby authorized and directed to file a notice of exemption under CEQA with respect to the approval of the Agreement.

4(e) of the Federal Power Act [16 U.S.C. §797(e)] and under any other applicable law and that no other conditions are required or shall be imposed.

5.C. <u>San Pasqual Undergrounding Project</u>. The San Pasqual Undergrounding Project will remove, relocate, and replace with an underground pipeline most or all of that portion of the Escondido Canal and its appurtenant structures, facilities, and rights-of-way that currently occupy land within the San Pasqual Reservation. The San Pasqual Undergrounding Project includes reclamation of the land occupied by the replaced canal by means of demolition, debris removal, grading, and reestablishment of drainage, as well as any associated mitigation of environmental impacts that may be required.

5.C.1. <u>Local Entities to Implement</u>. Escondido and Vista shall be jointly responsible for implementing the San Pasqual Undergrounding Project, the cost of which will be equally divided between them.

5.C.2. <u>Cooperation by San Pasqual and Grant of Easement</u>. San Pasqual will cooperate with and support Escondido and Vista in the implementation of the San Pasqual Undergrounding Project. In addition, San Pasqual will consent to the grant of an easement for the portion of the San Pasqual Undergrounding Project that will occupy San Pasqual Reservation land. There will be no charge for the easement.

5.C.3. Local Entities to Provide Access. In order to provide San Pasqual access to Local Exchange Water from the San Pasqual Undergrounding Project, during construction of the San Pasqual Undergrounding Project Escondido and Vista will install at their expense four stub sections of pipeline capped with blind flanges. The location of the four stub sections will be determined by San Pasqual in consultation with the Local Entities. In addition, San Pasqual will otherwise be provided access to Local Exchange Water from the Escondido Canal and the San Pasqual Undergrounding Project pipeline south of the northern boundary of the San Pasqual Reservation pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

5.C.4. <u>Schedule for Completion of Project and Remedies</u>. Subject to Uncontrollable Force, the Local Entities shall implement the San Pasqual Undergrounding

# Implementing Agreement Among Escondido, Vista, the Indian Water Authority, and La Jolla, Rincon, San Pasqual, Pauma and Pala Bands of Mission Indians

Project in good faith and with reasonable diligence. The Local Entities shall use their best efforts to complete the San Pasqual Undergrounding Project not later than six years from the Effective Date. If the Local Entities have not completed the San Pasqual Undergrounding Project within six years of the Effective Date, and to the extent that they have not been impaired by Uncontrollable Force, the Local Entities agree to compensate San Pasqual at the rate of \$1,000 per day from the expiration of the six-year deadline. Upon completion of the San Pasqual Undergrounding Project, no further charges shall be paid by the Local Entities to San Pasqual.

5.D. Indian Water Authority to Receive Parker-Davis Benefits for First 20 Years. The Indian Water Authority is entitled to all of the economic benefits from the initial 20 year allotment of Parker-Davis power from the Western Area Power Administration commencing October 1, 2008. Subsequent to the Effective Date, these economic benefits will be used for water supply, quality, infrastructure and other water-related operations and improvements.

5.D.1. <u>Allocation of Parker- Davis Benefits</u> After the First 20 Years. At the end of the initial 20 year term, the Indian Water Authority, the Bands, Escondido and Vista will jointly apply in good faith for a renewal of the Parker-Davis allotment. Whatever allotment is obtained, the economic benefits will be divided 50% to the Indian Water Authority and Bands, 25% to Escondido, and 25% to Vista. The Indian Water Authority will use its and the Bands' share of the economic benefits for water supply, quality, infrastructure and other water-related operations and improvements and Escondido and Vista will each use their shares of the economic benefits for the Local Water System. In addition to this joint application for Parker-Davis power, each Party may make and pursue its own separate application(s) for any other allotments of Parker-Davis power after the initial 20 year allotment that commences October 1, 2008. This section 5.D.1 shall not apply if and when the Local Entities exercise their right under Article XI to discontinue their responsibility to operate the Local Water System.

#### AGREEMENT FOR CONVEYANCE OF AN EASEMENT

This Agreement is made as of\_\_\_\_\_\_, 2019, between the City of Escondido, a California municipal corporation which includes its respective elected and appointed boards, officials, officers, agents, employees and volunteers (collectively the "City"), the Vista Irrigation District, a California independent special district which includes its respective elected and appointed boards, officials, officers, agents, employees and volunteers (collectively the "VID") and the San Pasqual Band of Diegueno Mission Indians of California, a Federal recognized Indian Tribe (the "Band"). The City, VID and the Band may also at times be individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively as "Parties."

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City, the VID, and the Band are Parties to that certain Implementing Agreement dated December 5, 2014 ("Implementing Agreement") concerning, among other things, the removal, relocation, and replacement of portions of the Escondido Canal within the San Pasqual Reservation with an underground pipeline; and

WHEREAS, as described in Section 5.C. of the Implementing Agreement, the City and VID are currently in the process of constructing pipeline utilities through the related project commonly known as the San Pasqual Undergrounding Project, ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Band has agreed to cooperate with and support the City and VID in the implementation of the Project and will grant an easement for the portion of the project that will occupy the Band's Reservation Land ("Reservation Easement"); and

WHEREAS, the Band is also the fee simple owner of the property located at 27509 N. Lake Wohlford Road, California, and also known as Assessor Parcel No. 189-060-08 (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to acquire and the Band agrees to convey an exclusive, permanent easement on the Property for water utility purposes in a location to be more particularly described in Section 3 ("Easement"); and

WHEREAS, there is a certain potable water well and appurtenances on the Property within the Easement area (the "Well") that the Band agrees may be decommissioned by the City and the VID; and

WHEREAS, the Band owns certain land in fee that is not contained within the San Pasqual Reservation, but is currently encumbered by the easement for the existing Escondido Canal which is to be replaced by the pipeline of the Project and this Easement known as Assessor Parcel Nos. 189-181-10 &16 ("Fee Land").

WHEREAS, the Parties now wish to establish the terms, conditions, and consideration associated with the acquisition of the Easement, the decommissioning of the Well, and the construction of the Project in the Easement area.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

### SECTION 1. RECITALS INCORPORATED

The Parties agree that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

#### SECTION 2. CONSIDERATION AND RELEASE

- 2.1 **Consideration for Easement.** In consideration for the Band's conveyance of the Easement, the City and VID will perform the following: (1) Pay the Band \$78,500 for the land and the Well occupied by the Easement; (2) at the City's and VID's sole expense, decommission the Well in accordance with the customs and practice for the industry and pursuant to all applicable laws and regulations; (3) at the City's and VID's sole expense remove that portion of the existing Escondido Canal occupying land owned by San Pasqual that lies outside the San Pasqual Reservation pursuant to the terms of section 5.C of the Implementing Agreement;(4) reclaim the said land from which the Escondido Canal has been removed pursuant to section 5.C of the Implementing Agreement; (5) upon completion of removal of the existing Escondido Canal from the San Pasqual Reservation and fee lands owned by San Pasqual, and reclamation of the land in the easement, at VID's and the City's sole expense relinquish the easements and clear the associated title for all of the Band's reservation and fee land from which the Escondido Canal has been removed.
- 2.2 **Release.** In exchange for the consideration above, the Band hereby unconditionally releases, relinquishes, and forever discharges the City and VID from any and all past, present or future obligations, duties, liabilities, rights, entitlements, responsibilities, demands, claims, actions, suits and causes of action of every kind and nature arising under or associated with the acquisition of the Easement and the decommissioning of the Well.
- 2.3 **Cal. Civ. Code §1542 Waiver.** The releases described above are full and final releases applying to all losses, including but not limited to damages, costs, expenses, and attorneys' fees, incurred by the Band, arising out of or in any way connected with the above-described matters. It is the intention of the Parties, in executing this agreement, that the same shall be effective as a bar to each and every claim, demand, and cause of action, by the Band based upon the above-described matters, and the Band knowingly, voluntarily, and expressly waive any and all rights and benefits otherwise conferred by the provisions of section 1542 of the California Civil Code which states as follows:

"A general release does not extend to claims which the creditor does not know or suspect to exist in his or her favor at the time of executing the release which, if known by him or her, must have materially affected his or her settlement with the debtor."

The Band expressly consents that, notwithstanding Section 1542 of the California Civil Code, this Agreement shall be given full and final effect according to each and all of its express terms and conditions, including those related to unknown and unsuspected claims, demands, and causes of action. The Parties acknowledge and agree that this waiver is an essential and material term of this Agreement and, without such waiver, this Agreement would not have been entered into.

BAND HEREBY WAIVES ALL RIGHTS AND PROTECTIONS OTHERWISE AVAILABLE TO IT UNDER §1542, HAVING HAD FULL OPPORTUNITY TO CONSULT WITH COUNSEL OF ITS CHOOSING REGARDING THE MATTER.

#### SECTION 3. DEDICATION OF EASEMENT

- 3.1 **Dedication.** For the consideration set forth in section 2.1 herein, the Band will execute the grant deed conveying the Easement to the City in substantially the same form as Attachment A.
- 3.2 **Exclusive.** This Easement is exclusive to the City. However, the Band may use the area in ways that do not interfere with the City's use of the Easement as determined by the City.

#### SECTION 4. DECOMMISSIONING OF THE WELL

4.1 **Payment.** The consideration in section 2.1 herein includes any compensation due to the Band for the loss of the use or decommissioning of the Well, or both.

#### SECTION 5. RECLAMATION AND TITLE

5.1 **Reclamation of Fee Land.** As part of the consideration set forth in section 2.1 herein the City and VID will provide for the reclamation of the Fee Land at their expense pursuant to Section 5.C of the Implementing Agreement and promptly upon the completion of the reclamation of the existing Escondido Canal on San Pasqual Reservation land. Said reclamation will be by means of demolition, debris removal, grading, and reestablishment of drainage, as well as any associated mitigation of environmental impacts that may be required. The timing for completion of the reclamation shall be a reasonable time frame after the Project is completed and water is being delivered through the new underground pipeline, not to exceed 12 months from both of those conditions precedent.

#### **SECTION 6 CONSTRUCTION**

6.1 **Temporary License.** Band hereby grants the City and VID a temporary license for construction to provide for the storage, access, or other use that the City will need to complete construction of the Project ("Temporary License"). The Temporary License will be adjacent to the Easement areas as necessary. The Temporary License will expire upon completion of the Project.

- 6.2 **Costs.** City will pay all costs for the Project in the Easement and the Band will not be billed for any survey, construction, repair, or other work performed on behalf of the City and VID in connection with the Project.
- 6.3 **Restoration.** The City will restore to original condition any damage or impact to Band's roads or other existing improvements, including the chain link fence on the Property, caused by the City's construction of the Project in the Easement area, other than the Well.

#### SECTION 7. MISCELLANEOUS

- 7.1 **Binding Effect.** Each and every provision of this Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the respective successors and assigns of the Parties hereto, in the same manner as if such Parties had been expressly named herein.
- 7.2 **No Obligation to Third Parties.** This Agreement is made and entered into for the sole protection and benefit of the Parties and their successors and assigns. No other person shall have any right of action based upon any provision in this Agreement.
- 7.3 **Drafting.** Each Party has cooperated in the drafting and preparation of this Agreement and any construction to be made of this Agreement, shall not be construed against any Party.
- 7.4 **Consultation with Counsel.** Each of the Parties to this Agreement hereby acknowledges that it has executed this Agreement with the consent, and upon the advice, of its own attorney.
- 7.5 **Effect of Waiver**. No waiver by a Party of any provision of this Agreement shall be considered a waiver of any other provision or any subsequent breach of the same or any other provision. The exercise by a Party of any right or remedy provided in this Agreement or provided by law shall not prevent the exercise by that Party of any other remedy provided in this Agreement or under the law.
- 7.6 **Notices.** All notices and other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed given when personally delivered or if sent by certified mail, postage prepaid, with return receipt requested, to the correct address as indicated below:

- 7.7 **Captions.** The captions and headings herein are for convenience and reference only and do not limit or construe the provisions of this Agreement.
- 7.8 **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Parties hereto, and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, representations, and understandings of the Parties. The terms of this Agreement are contractual in nature and not a mere recital. This Agreement is executed without reliance upon any representation by any person concerning the nature or extent of damages or legal liability therefore, and each signer of this Agreement has carefully read and understood the contents of this Agreement and signs the same as his or her own free act.
- 7.9 **Amendment.** This Agreement may not be amended, modified, or supplemented except by a writing executed by the party against whom such amendment, modification, or supplement is sought to be enforced.
- 7.10 **Choice of Law.** This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of California. Venue for all actions arising from this Agreement must be exclusively in the North County Division of the San Diego County Superior Court or federal courts located in San Diego County, California.
- 7.11 **Sovereign Immunity.** The Band waives its sovereign immunity with respect to the transfer of real property and any of the other matters contained in this Agreement.
- 7.12 **Anti-Assignment Clause.** The Band may not assign, delegate or transfer any interest or duty under this Agreement without advance written approval of the City and VID.
- 7.13 **Execution in Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts or by facsimile transmission, each of which shall be deemed an original with the same effect as if all signatures were on the same instrument.
- 7.14 **Costs.** The respective Parties shall separately bear any and all costs associated with this Agreement or the Easement.
- 7.15 **Representation of Authority.** Each Party represents and warrants to the others that it has the full right and authority to enter into this Release and Settlement Agreement, and further that it has the power, authority and ability to carry out the obligations assumed and promised hereunder, and is not presently aware of any pending event that would, or could, hamper, hinder, delay, or prevent the timely performance of said obligations.
  - 7.15.1 **San Pasqual.** The San Pasqual Band of Mission Indians represents and warrants to the other Parties that, by virtue of the resolutions adopted by its General Council and Tribal Council that are attached hereto as Attachments B and C, its chairperson has the full right and authority to: (1) sign this Agreement on behalf of the San Pasqual Band of Mission Indians and (2) if necessary represent in open court in the United States District Court for the Southern District of California that the San Pasqual Band of Mission Indians understands and agrees with the terms

of this Agreement, validly exercised its governmental power to be bound by its terms, and that the San Pasqual Band of Mission Indians has received adequate legal representation in reaching that conclusion.

- 7.15.2 **Escondido**. The City of Escondido represents and warrants to the other Parties that, by virtue of a resolution adopted by its City Council that is attached hereto as Attachment D, its Mayor has the full right and authority to: (1) sign this Agreement on behalf of the City of Escondido and (2) if necessary represent in open court in the United States District Court for the Southern District of California that the City of Escondido understands and agrees with the terms of this Agreement, validly exercised its governmental power to be bound by its terms, and that the City of Escondido has received adequate legal representation in reaching that conclusion.
- 7.15.3 **Vista**. The Vista Irrigation District represents and warrants to the other Parties that, by virtue of a resolution adopted by its Board of Directors that is attached hereto as Attachment E, its President has the full right and authority to: (1) sign this Agreement on behalf of the Vista Irrigation District and (2) if necessary represent in open court in the United States District Court for the Southern District of California that the Vista Irrigation District understands and agrees with the terms of this Agreement, validly exercised its governmental power to be bound by its terms, and that the Vista Irrigation District has received adequate legal representation in reaching that conclusion.







#### SUBJECT: ANNUAL CONTRACT FOR PAVING SERVICES

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Authorize the General Manager to amend the existing contract with Joe's Paving, Inc. to provide paving services on District projects in an amount not to exceed \$800,000 and to extend the contract with proposed new pricing for fiscal year 2020 in an amount not to exceed \$800,000.

<u>PRIOR BOARD ACTION</u>: On July 5, 2017, the Board authorized the General Manager to enter into a contractual service agreement with Joe's Paving, Inc. to provide paving services on District projects requiring less than 8,000 square feet of paving for fiscal year 2018 in an amount not to exceed \$600,000. On May 2, 2018, the Board authorized the General Manager to amend the existing contract with Joe's Paving, Inc. to provide paving services on District projects under the formal bidding threshold of \$60,000 and to extend the contract for fiscal year 2019 in an amount not to exceed \$600,000.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT</u>: The proposed amendment will increase the maximum contract amount by \$200,000 from \$600,000 to \$800,000 for the fiscal year 2019. The proposed contract amount for fiscal year 2020 is an amount not to exceed \$800,000.

<u>SUMMARY</u>: Annually, the District generates approximately 24,000 square feet of patch paving and requires pavement restoration services for over two miles of trench line to support the mainline replacement program. Board authorized revisions to the paving contract have allowed for a larger quantity of paving projects to be captured under contract versus being formally bid, enhancing the District's ability to be responsive in the repair of roadways. For the first three quarters of fiscal year 2019, the District has used approximately 92 percent (or \$550,000) of the existing contract amount with Joe's Paving Inc.; amending the contract to increase the amount by \$200,000 (from \$600,000 to \$800,000) is projected to capture paving services needed for the remainder of fiscal year 2019.

Joe's Paving, Inc. has submitted proposed price increases for the optional contract extension for fiscal year 2020. The pricing reflects increases in material and prevailing wage labor costs; Joe's Paving, Inc. has provided information to justify the requested increase. Additionally, staff acquired recent bid information from Padre Dam Municipal Water District (Padre Dam) for annual paving with comparable unit pricing. After reviewing the information, staff feels the cost increases are adequately justified and bidding the contract would likely not yield lower costs based on the current bidding climate.

<u>DETAILED REPORT</u>: Since 2015, the District has progressively expanded the scope of the annual paving contract from jobs under 350 square feet to encompassing jobs up to the formal bidding threshold of \$60,000. The expanded scope of the contract has significantly enhanced the District's ability to be responsive in the restoration of roadways related to the mainline replacement program as well as maintenance and repair activities.

In fiscal years 2017 and 2018, the District spent approximately \$761,000 annually for paving services (via the paving contract and competitively bid jobs) with more work being covered under the paving contract in the latter fiscal year (26 percent or \$197,000 in fiscal year 2017 versus 63 percent or 480,000 in fiscal year 2018). During the first three quarters of fiscal year 2019 all paving (\$550,000) services have been performed under the paving contract, leaving \$50,000 available for the balance of work to be performed this fiscal year. Staff estimates that \$200,000 will need to be added contract amount to capture patch paving and mainline replacement paving services needed for the remainder of fiscal year 2019.

As permitted under the terms of the current contract, Joe's Paving, Inc. submitted proposed unit price increases for paving as well as mobilization fees and other labor-related line items. Since June 2017, asphalt prices have risen approximately 25 percent (\$47.00 to \$58.00 per ton) and prevailing wage labor rates for fiscal years 2018-2020 will have increased between 6 and 7 percent for classification groups specific to paving operations. Joe's Paving, Inc.'s pricing has remained the same since 2017.

To validate the proposed increases submitted by Joe's Paving, Inc., staff compared unit pricing from recent bid results conducted by Padre Dam for annual paving for fiscal year 2020. For base paving and cap course on jobs less than 750 square feet, Joe's Paving, Inc. was approximately 26 percent (or \$4.60 per square foot) below Padre Dam's lowest bid and approximately 47 percent less (or \$8.64 per square foot) than the lowest bid for jobs between 751 and 3,000 square feet range (table below).

## <u>SUBJECT</u>: ANNUAL CONTRACT FOR TRAFFIC CONTROL SERVICES

<u>**RECOMMENDATION</u>**: Authorize the General Manager to execute an agreement with Cecilia's Safety Service, Inc. to provide traffic control services for District jobs in an amount not to exceed \$550,000.</u>

PRIOR BOARD ACTION: None.

FISCAL IMPACT: This contract is proposed for an amount not to exceed \$550,000.

<u>SUMMARY</u>: The District advertised and solicited bids from licensed contractors to perform traffic control services throughout the District's service area. In response, the District received three qualified bids. Hudson Safe-T-Lite Rentals also submitted a bid; however, it was non-responsive because the company does not a warehouse location in north San Diego County as required in the bid specifications. Cecilia's Safety Service, Inc. responded with the lowest overall bid based on labor rates for flagging and traffic plan services.

<u>DETAILED REPORT</u>: Over the last ten years, the District has increasingly used outside traffic control services in an effort to minimize costs, better utilize District staff and reduce the time that water is out of service during construction and repair. Outsourcing these services provides our customers and field crews a safe and efficient work environment, and also transfers associated risk.

As Cecilia's Safety Service, Inc. and Bechtel Services submitted overlapping rates, staff reviewed billed rates for traffic control services over the last three fiscal years. Regular hour rates consisted of 85 percent of billed labor; overtime rates were 12 percent and billed labor for weekends and holidays comprised 3 percent. Based on this historical data and the proposed hourly rates submitted by each company, Cecilia's Safety Services, Inc. would provide the lowest cost service on an annual basis.

All local traffic jurisdictions within the District's service area require an approved set of traffic control plans with each project submitted in addition to requiring certified flaggers on all projects. The traffic control services provider will prepare traffic control plans and provide all certified flaggers and insurance per District requirements.
